Tier 3: High Alert

Liverpool, Merseyside & Wirral were put into Tier 3: Very High Alert restrictions which came into force on Thursday 31stDecember 2020.

This addendum reflects any additional control measures in Early Years settings which will be affected during the period in Tier 3:

- staff who are pregnant
- use of face coverings
- clinically extremely vulnerable pupils
- clinically extremely vulnerable staff
- wraparound provision and extra-curricular activity
- physical activity in schools


Background

The DfE has published <u>actions for schools during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak</u>. Schools should continue to review their full opening of school risk assessments and implement the system of controls set out in this guidance. These measures provide a framework for school leaders to put in place proportionate protective measures for pupils and staff. If schools follow the guidance and maximise control measures, they can be confident they are managing risk effectively.

School will discuss flexibilities that support CEV staff, such as staggered start times to reduce travel during rush hour. All other staff continue to attend work, including those living in a household with someone who is clinically extremely vulnerable. 	3X2=6	
Clinically vulnerable staff and children at increased risk of contracting COVID 19	Staff, pupils, parents, visitors increased risk of transmission of Coronavirus (COVID 19)	 Staff and children who are clinically vulnerable or have underlying health conditions but are not clinically extremely vulnerable should continue to attend school in line with current guidance. School will carry out a risk assessment on each member of staff identified as clinically vulnerable Staff should follow all measures in pace in school for their safety. 	3X2=6	
Pregnant employees at increased risk of contracting COVID 19	Staff, pupils, parents, visitors increased risk of transmission of Coronavirus (COVID 19)	 School will carry out a risk assessment to follow the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 (MHSW). Pregnant women are considered 'clinically vulnerable' or in some cases 'clinically extremely vulnerable' to coronavirus (COVID-19) and therefore require special consideration as set out in the guidance for pregnant employees. Out-of-school activities and wraparound childcare increased risk of contracting COVID 19	Staff, pupils, parents, visitors increased risk of transmission of Coronavirus (COVID 19)	 Pregnant women of any gestation should not be required to continue working if this is not supported by the risk assessment. Women who are 28 weeks pregnant and beyond, or are pregnant and have an underlying health condition that puts them at a greater risk of severe illness from COVID-19 at any gestation, should take a more precautionary approach. School will ensure pregnant staff are able to adhere to any active national guidance on social distancing and/or advice for pregnant women considered to be clinically extremely vulnerable. Out-of-school settings and wraparound childcare should continue to operate for face-to-face provision between 4 and 18 January 2021 for children who eligible to attend school for full-time on-site provision 	3X2=6	
		 School has worked closely with our external wraparound providers to ensure as far as possible; children can be kept in a group with other children from the same bubble they are in during the school day. The provider will seek to keep children in small, consistent groups with the same children each time, as far as this is possible.

Parent and child groups - increased risk of transmission of COVID 19	Staff, pupils, parents, visitors increased risk of transmission of Coronavirus (COVID 19)	 Parent and child groups will check for any additional relevant guidance for their local restriction tier and should only be held in venues and spaces that are permitted to be open and not in private dwellings. To find out which local restriction tier applies to a particular postcode, use the search tool: find out the coronavirus (COVID-19) restrictions in a local area. Parent and child groups that meet in: Ofsted registered settings can operate in all local restriction tiers community spaces, such as in a place of worship, community centre or library, can operate in all local restriction tiers and should follow COVID secure guidance for the venue It is important for group participants to maintain: good hand hygiene.
