


Year 2 History: Who were the kings and queens before King Charles III?

Key Facts:

King Charles III was born on 14th November, 1948.

He became King on 8th September 2022, following the death of his mother and our late queen, Queen Elizabeth II (our oldest and longest serving monarch).

He has two children – Prince William (who is next in line to become king) and Prince Harry. He also has five grandchildren.

He married his second wife, Camilla (now known as the Queen Consort) on 9th April 2005.

Vocabulary

History	The study of the past to understand how people and society behaved.
King/Queen	A male ruler (king) and female ruler (queen) who inherits the position by being born into the royal family
Monarch	Often a king or queen who has control over a kingdom or empire.
Coronation	The ceremony at which the king or queen is crowned.
Reign	The period of rule over a Monarch.
Prince/Princess	The son (prince) or daughter (princess) of a monarch.
Timeline	A list of important events.
Chronological	The correct order of events as they occurred over time.
Duty	A task that a person is required to perform as part of one's job.
Family tree	Shows the relationship between people in several generations of a family.
Succession	The order in which a monarch's family will take over the throne.
Heir	A person who inherits or is entitled to the property or rank of another on that person's death.
Abdicate	To stop controlling or managing something that you are in charge of.
