



YEAR 1 – Introducing Colour


Artist focus – Vincent Van Gogh

What I should already know:

Key Facts:

The Starry Night was created by Vincent Van Gogh using oil paints in 1889.

Vincent Van Gogh created his famous 'Sunflowers' painting using oil paints in 1888. It is displayed in the National Gallery in London.

There are 3 primary colours – red, yellow and blue. Secondary colours are made by mixing primary colours together.

Vocabulary

Medium/media	The materials used to create the art work.
Primary colours	Red, yellow and blue.
Secondary colours	Orange, green and purple.
Shade	Comparing light and dark.
Tone	The lightness and darkness of something.
Vincent Van Gogh	A Dutch post-impressionist painter who painted over 200 art works. His most famous paintings include: The Starry Night, Sunflowers and Café Terrace at Night.
