Art at St Peters

This term we have had an artist, Nicola McGovern working with all of our children. Year 6 used their weaving skills to make fantastic Mexican God Eyes. Year 5 developed their skills in finger-knitting to create a beautiful class river scene.

Year 4 used their printing skills to make impressive scarab beetles, while Year 3 made eyecatching prints in the style of Andy Warhol. Year 1 and Year 2, who have been learning about the Titanic, really enjoyed working with paper mache to make boats. Our Foundation Stage Children have made lovely sun-catchers and enjoyed learning to weave. The children have really enjoyed learning new art and craft techniques and showed tremendous creativity. We are very impressed by their creations.

One World Week

During One World Week at the end of January, a range of visitors have helped our children to explore and celebrate similarities and differences within our own and other world religions and cultures.

Whilst working with the Fun Food Chef, the children have enjoyed learning about Brazilian culture and food. We all enjoyed the wonderful aromas drifting around the school as the children prepared, cooked and ate delicious Feijoada (a Brazilian stew), Acaraje (black eye pea fritters with tomato & prawn sauce), Brazilian cheese bread, greens, and pineapple, mint & passion fruit smoothie

Working with their teachers, the children learned about a range of world faiths including: Hinduism, Buddhism, Sikhism, Judaism, and Islam

The Multi Ethnic Achievement Service have given our children the opportunity to hear Portuguese and Polish stories delivered by bilingual teachers. The children really enjoyed the experience, especially in creating artwork from each



culture.

Musicians from a company called 'The Pop Project' also visited school during one world week to explore music from a range of cultures and eras with the children. Staff and children alike thoroughly enjoyed this experience.

Our children also had the opportunity to learn traditional and modern Indian dance in Bharatanatyam and Bollywood Dance workshops with Mrs Beesley. The children really enjoyed this experience and showed great promise as dancers.

Our children from Year 1 and 2 have been preparing packed lunches for Wirral's homeless this half-term. In know that the packed lunches are much appreciated and gratefully received. A big thank you should go to our staff and children for their hard work, thoughtfulness and care.
